Bob Pascal's life reads like a history of leadership. Through the evolving worlds of education, sports, politics and business, Bob has been always maintained a dynamic force.

Robert A. Pascal was born, raised and attended public school in New Jersey. A gifted athlete, Bob attended Duke University, studying Economics and making his mark on the gridiron. Bob Pascal earned first-team All-America honors as a halfback in 1955. He led the Blue Devils in rushing two seasons in a row and was named MVP of the 1955 Duke team. Bob was also a two-time first team All-ACC selection, becoming the first player in Duke History to accomplish such a feat. His junior season the Blue Devils captured the Orange Bowl crown with a 34-7 victory over Nebraska. Pascal's play led to his being selected in the third round on the NFLs draft by the Baltimore Colts.

Before entering the private sector, Bob Pascal was a well known public figure, having served the state of Maryland in a multitude of capacities. Pascal served as State Appointments Secretary to Governor William Donald Schaefer, as Anne Arundel County Executive and as a Maryland State Senator.

Pascal's entrepreneurial involvements began with the purchase of United Propane and have expanded to include the hospitality industry, banking and real estate development. Built in 1986, the St. Michael's Harbour Inn, Marina and Spa was acquired in 1989 by a group including Mr. Pascal. In February of 1999, Robert Pascal became the principle and active owner of the hotel. Since then, an evolutionary process of upgrading the property has been a large part of Mr. Pascal's agenda. Always looking at industry desires, Bob added The Spa at Harbour Inn to the property in 2004.

Pascal's love of nature has led to his extensive involvement in land and waterfowl conservation issues. Bob, an avid hunter and fisherman, can often be found enjoying the outdoors in Talbot and Dorchester Counties.
